Ageing research funding by Research Councils

Long history of funding ageing research in the Research Councils

Approximately £200m spend on ageing research in current CSR plus large underpinning ageing-related portfolio

- Vast majority in response-mode by individual Councils
- Strategic initiatives including in partnerships
- Relatively small proportion in joint Council programmes NDA and LLHW







Ageing research: LLHW

Since 2008 LLHW has committed £51m, funded 54 awards and 60 PhD and post docs. Examples of projects funded through LLHW:

- Inequalities in later life frailty and wellbeing: an interdisciplinary approach to causality (Nazroo)
- The menopausal transition and healthy ageing and wellbeing (Lawlor)
- Engaging with Older People to Develop and Deliver Interventions for the self management of Chronic Pain (Smith)
- Uncertain Futures: Managing Late-Career Transitions and Extended Working Life (Vickerstaff)
- Extending Working Lives in the National Health Service: Opportunities, Challenges and Prospects (Nolan)
- Mobility, Mood and Place: a user-centred approach to design of built environments to make mobility easy, enjoyable and meaningful for older people (Ward Thompson)
- Over-Hear: assessing functionality of hearing aids in complex listening environments (McAlpine/Brimijoin)




What next?


